Preparing to apply...do I have what I need?

- Do I know my area of specialty?
- Is the program a good fit?
- Have I talked to faculty, students, or the graduate program director to discuss research and professional interests?
- Do I need to consider the location of the institution?
- Have I considered the program format?
- Have I identified faculty or mentors willing to write a letter of recommendation, if needed?

Semester Term Start/End Dates

Term	Classes Begin	Semester Ends
Spring/Summer 2024	May 3, 2024	August 1, 2024
Fall 2024	August 26, 2024	December 31, 2024
Winter 2025	January 6, 2025	April 29, 2025



General Application Deadlines

Semester	Domestic students	Canadian and international students
Fall (begins in August)	Apply by June 1	Apply by May 1
Winter (begins in January)	Apply by Oct. 1	Apply by Sept. 1
Spring/summer (spring begins in May; summer in June)	Apply by Feb. 1	Apply by Jan. 1

International applicants should allocate time for visa processing.



Program Application Deadlines

Academic programs establish their own application deadlines, so be sure to research these on the program information pages to ensure that you are applying by the program's application deadline.


Also, some academic programs only admit applicants for specific terms (e.g. fall term). Again, check the <u>academic program</u> for deadline, term, and contact information.

Step 1: Fulfill Admission Requirements



2 Types of Admission Requirements

- Graduate School
- Department/Program



Graduate School admission requirements

- Bachelor's degree or foreign degree <u>equivalent</u> to a 4year U.S. bachelor's degree
- Minimum GPA of 2.75 for grad certificate or master's degree; 3.0 for doctorate (department/program may set higher minimums)

 Proof of English proficiency (nonnative speakers of English)

	Regular Admission (no ELI check-in)	Admission Proficiency (ELI check-in)
TOEFL iBT	79+	75-78
IETLS	6.5+	N/A
Duolingo	110+	N/A

^{*}ELI (English Language Institute)

- Exemptions
 - English-speaking country
 - Earned bachelor's degree or higher from a U.S. institution



Program admission requirements

Typical Program/Department determines requirement

- GPA minimum
- Statement of Purpose/Personal Statement
- Letters of recommendation
- CV/Resume
- GRE/GMAT



Common application materials for Review

Graduate School—

- transcript copy (unofficial) of all post-secondary degrees and coursework (i.e., bachelor's degree, master's, etc.)
- English proficiency test score report (non-native speakers of English) copy (unofficial)

Program/department—

- letters of recommendation
- statement of purpose
- CV/ resumé
- writing sample
- test scores (i.e., GRE, GMAT, etc.)
- portfolio, etc.

Step 2: Begin the online application



The application fee is waived. There is no application fee!

Create an admissions account and submit an application

- Select your Term and Program
- Provide personal information
- Answer all required questions (*)
- Enter academic history
- Self-report test scores (GRE, GMAT, TOEFL, etc.)
- Add recommender(s) contact name/email
- Digitally sign the application
- Submit the application



Step 3: Upload Copies of Unofficial Transcripts/ Test Scores/Required Materials



Transcript/Test Score/Required materials

- Login to your personal account portal and upload copies of transcripts and test scores (official documents only required if admitted)
 - Degree-in-progress
 - Degree conferred
- Wayne State <u>does not require</u> <u>official transcripts, test scores, or</u> <u>documents to support the I-20 process unless you've received</u> admission

*Note: Programs may require an academic evaluation prior to admission, especially 3-year bachelor's degree.



Step 4: Monitor your Status



Step 4: Monitor your application/admission status

- Once your transcript and test score materials are uploaded and verified, you will receive an email stating that your application is "in review with your academic program." If you have questions on academic requirements or the time to admission decision, contact your program of interest direct.
- You may check the status of your application at any time using your login credentials.

Admission Review

Faculty or Committee Review

Actively looking for students

Holistic review of:

- Undergraduate institution
- Grades and courses
- Letters of recommendation
- Statement of purpose
- Test scores
- Interview (if required)
- Research experience (including fit to program/faculty research)
- Professional experience



Admission Process

Submit Application

Apply online to a graduate program. The application fee is WAIVED!

Graduate Admissions reviews application for University requirements then forwards to program/department for review and admission decision.

Program/Department Review & Recommendat for Admission Program/department reviews application and forwards recommended decision to Graduate Admissions.

Decision Notificati

Graduate admissions processes the admission recommendation and notifies the applicant via email. Applicant receives a link to the decision letter. If student is admitted, the letter contains their Wayne State Access ID and information for registering for courses.



Your Decision Letter

You will receive an email stating that "a decision has been made on your application," prompting you to login to your application to view the decision letter. A decision letter will not be mailed.
