2019-2020 Munich Exchange Fellowship Application Deadline: April 1, 2019

The Graduate School is pleased to announce the continuation of an arrangement with The University of Munich whereby a Wayne State University graduate student can study in Munich for one academic year while his/her German counterpart attends Wayne State University.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Admission to a program of graduate study at Wayne State University
- Proficiency in the German language unless enrolling in courses taught in English
- A good academic record and demonstrated capacity for independent study
- Relevancy of study or research program in Munich to program at Wayne State University

FINANCIAL INFORMATION AND OTHER MATTERS

- The Fellowship is adequate to support only the awardee. Consequently, married candidates must be prepared to support their dependents.
- WSU graduate students who are awarded a Fellowship by the WSU Graduate School to study at LMU Munich will be provided a tuition waiver from the Ludwig-Maximilians Universitat, Munich. The WSU Graduate School will provide the WSU student(s) with a cost of living allowance to assist the student(s) with day-to-day expenses during their studies in Munich. Expenses not covered by the tuition waiver and cost of living allowance will be the responsibility of the Fellow.
- LMU Munich will make any reasonable effort to place WSU exchange students in student accommodation. The exchange students from WSU will be responsible for all room and board expenses.
- The Fellow will be required to comply with the health insurance policies and procedures for international students at the host institution for the duration of the program.
- Independent travel arrangements should be made. Travel expenses are not included in the Exchange Fellowship.
- Please note that foreign universities generally do not give degrees after only a year of study or research. Therefore, applicants should not make the attainment of a foreign degree the object of their application.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE AND INFORMATION

- Applicants should confer with their advisors before initiating formal application for the Fellowship.
- Applicants should make certain that all parts of the application are submitted by the April 1, 2019 deadline.
- Award notification will be by mail in mid-May 2019.

- Submit transcripts from all degree granting schools attended and a current Wayne State University transcript.

- Ask three faculty members to submit letters of recommendation on your behalf.
- Ask a professor from the German Languages and Literatures Department to submit a German language proficiency report on your behalf if taking courses in German.
- Submit a Statement of Proposed Study
- Submit a Personal Statement
