



3MT Overview

- 3MT is a research communication competition developed by The University of Queensland in 2008.
- Participants present their thesis work in a short presentation in 3 min, using a single slide.
- The competition challenges students to distill their research ideas and discoveries into a concise, compelling presentation that can be understood by a general, non-specialist audience.

Three-Minute Thesis (3MT) guidelines





3 Tips for 3MT

Ask following three questions from you prior to your 3MT presentation.

- 1. How does your research relate to the real world?
- 2. How do you grab the attention of your audience?
- 3. How much you practice for your 3MT?



3 Tips for 3 MT

1. How your research change the world?

- Think about the big picture of your research.
- > Simply think about the take home message of your presentation.

My Thesis Title: Investigation of the *in vivo* activity of ribosome-targeting peptides and aminoglycosides in *Escherichia coli*.

My 3MT Title: Combat antibiotic resistance: No Action Today No Cure Tomorrow.



3 Tips for 3 MT

- 2. How do you grab the attention of your audience?
- > Start your talk with an attractive opening statement
- > Show your enthusiasm on your research.
- > Your body language, eye contact, facial expressions, voice control play big role
- Act like a story teller and deliver a simple message in an interesting way
- Remember to pause at key points as it gives the audience time to think about what you are saying.

3 Tips for 3MT

3. How much you practice your presentation?

- > Practice makes it perfect.
- Record / video tape your presentation and watch and listen to hear where you pause, speak too quickly or get it just right. Then work on your weaknesses and exploit your strengths.
- > Pay your attention to the time. It has to be three minutes. That is the challenging part.
- Feeling nervous before you presentation is natural, but it is important to practice so you can present confidently and clarity.

Eligibility

3MT WSU

The competition is open to graduate students completing a thesis or a dissertation.

Awards

- •First place \$1000 plus the registration fee to attend the Midwestern Association of Graduate Schools competition
- •Second place \$500 award
- •Third place \$300 award

The winner of the competition will serve as the Wayne State representative to the regional 3MT competition conducted by the Midwestern Association of Graduate Schools.


Rules

- Single static PowerPoint slide permitted
 - Clear, legible, and concise
 - Does not have to include text
 - No slide transitions, animations, sound or 'movement'
 - No additional electronic media (e.g. sound and video files)
 - Attach as separate file when submitting 3MT video
 - Show slide from beginning to end of oration during Graduate and Post-Doctoral Research Symposium
- No additional props permitted




One slide plays a big role

- YOU are the presentation, not the slide.
- The slide must enhance, not detract, from your words.



Bacterial ribosome as a drug target



3MT WSU

Rules

- Presentations limited to 3 minutes
- Begins when presenter starts presentation through either movement or speech
- Presentation occurs from stage/front of room during symposium/ virtual platform
- Cannot be delivered in poem or song-form but quotes/lyrics permitted if relevant to thesis topic
- Decision of the adjudicating panel is final



3MT WSU

Judging Criteria

- Presentations will be judged by the participating audience.
- Every member of the audience will vote for their top three presentations according to the criteria listed below.
 (Each audience member can vote only once for a specific competitor.)
- The scores from all audience members will be compiled to determine the winners.



Comprehension and content

3MT WSU

Did the presenter,

- Provide an understanding of the background to the research question being addressed and its significance?
- Clearly describe key results of research including conclusions and outcomes?
- Follow a clear and logical sequence?
- Communicate in language appropriate to a non-specialist audience?
- Use a clear, legible, and concise PowerPoint slide that enhanced presentation?

Comprehension and content 3MT WSU

Did the presenter,

- Avoid scientific jargon, explain terminology and provide adequate background information to illustrate points?
- Spend adequate time on each element of their presentation?

Engagement and communication

- Capture and maintain their audience's attention? Eye contacts, hand movements, vocal range
- Convey enthusiasm for their research?
- Make the audience want to know more?

Presenters' Recommendations

- Practice makes it perfect.
- Record and listen to your presentation to hear where you pause, speak too quickly or get it just right. Then work on your weaknesses and exploit your strengths.
- Dress professionally and comfortably.
- Deliver an easy message.
- Make sure the slide gives the big picture of your research to the audience.




